Report on EPP Savings – Hospital Authority

Total value of EPP savings in 2001-02: **\$539.269m**, equivalent to **2.0%** of total recurrent baseline expenditure in that year that is subject to EPP. Total EPP savings (as a percentage of recurrent baseline expenditure subject to EPP) achieved by 2001-02 on a **cumulative** basis is **3.0%**.

Subventions	385.999	 Centralise and network hospital services among hospitals or clusters to achieve economy of scale, including relocation of obstetric and neonatology inpatient services from Tsan Yuk Hospital (TYH) to Queen Mary Hospital (QMH), and remodelling TYH into an ambulatory centre providing specialist outpatient services; 	With declining birth rates, it is more cost-effective to rationalize obstetric services in the two hospitals to achieve optimal utilization of delivery services. Quality of patient care can also be improved. Before the rationalization of services, the obstetric and the neonatal intensive care services were operated at two locations. Doctors have to operate in two teams and commute between the two hospitals to take care of emergency cases. Critically ill or premature babies at TYH have to be transferred to QMH for more comprehensive intensive care and paediatric surgery. After the relocation, patients can receive such medical treatments directly at QMH.
